

Early Childhood Services

Early Childhood Services provides family-centered early intervention services to children (birth through 3 years of age), who have or are at risk for developmental delay. Services support families and other caregivers in their efforts to promote optimal development in each child, by creatively developing strategies to help the child participate in the activities and routines that are of interest to the child and are most important to the family. The services we offer include:

- Health Services (to enable the child to benefit from other early intervention services)
- Medical Services (for diagnostic and evaluation purposes)

- Special Instruction (developmental consultation)
- Speech/Language Pathology Services
- Transportation (to enable the child/family to receive early intervention services)
